Although the world's finances may not be looking too bright, the good news is that your club has managed to keep its fees at the same low level they were


back in 2010.

Commbank Kaching is currently available for iPhone 4S, iPhone 4 and iPhone 3GS.



A free PDF converter

There are a number of ways to convert a text document to the very handy **Portable Document File** (pdf) format.

One of the simplest ways is by using the free program called CutePDF.

CutePDF creates a virtual printer in your computer. To do the actual conversion you simply send the document to the CutePDF printer (which

will appear as one of your printers) and the computer will suggest a file name, then press “save” – simple!

Where to get it
Go to www.cutepdf.com and then click on the [free](#) version. You then download

two programs:
1. CutePDF Writer (CuteWriter.exe)
2. GPL Ghostscript (converter.exe)
How to Install it

First run *CuteWriter.exe* which will install the printer. Then run *converter.exe* which will complete the process.

One of the great things about CutePDF is that there is no trial period and the program will not include any nuisance messages – unlike some other pdf converters.

PS. Word 2007 and Word 2010 include a **pdf** converter under their “Save” functions.

What is a Cookie?

A **cookie**, is used for an origin website to send state information to a user's browser and for the browser to return the state information to the origin site.

Cookies cannot be programmed, cannot carry viruses, and cannot install malware on the host computer. However, they can be used by spyware to track user's browsing activities, a major privacy concern that prompted European and US law makers to take action.
